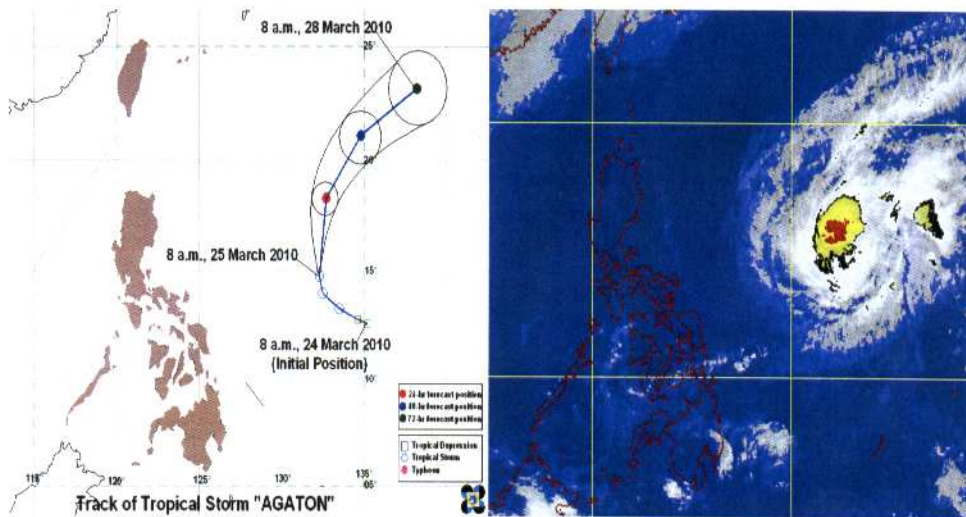

No public storm warning signal was raised.


