1. Whirlwinds "Buhawi"/Storm Surge in Siasi, Sulu

- ❖ As per info from Mr Tingkasan Asanul of ACC/MDCC Siasi, a strong whirlwinds /storm surge or "Buhawi" hit Laminusa Island, Siasi, Sulu on or about 3:00 AM of 5 July 2010,
- ❖ There were six (6) barangays affected namely: Tong, Tenggara, Tampakan, Luuk, Puokan and Kong-Kong all in Laminusa island, Siasi, Sulu
- ❖ A total of 162 houses were damaged (29 totally and 133 partially) affecting 162 families/810 persons. These families are now staying in their respective relatives
- ❖ The Badjao Learning Center was heavily damaged

Actions Taken

- ❖ MDCC Siasi immediately provided food assistance to the affected families

2. Initial Report on Oil Spill Incident in Bacolod City

- ❖ The Philippine Coast Guard Station Iloilo reported that an oil spill incident occurred in the vicinity of BREDCO Port, Bacolod City on or about 12:05 PM July 6, 2010 due to the leakage of broken/deteriorated underwater pipeline of Chevron Depot Bacolod
- ❖ A minimal extent of leakage was noted approximately one (1) liter per hour but it was already controlled

Actions Taken

- ❖ CDCC Iloilo coordinated with Chevron, Petron and Shell Depot to utilize their respective spill equipment /boom

3. Initial Report re Flooding in Maguindanao and North Cotabato Provinces

- ❖ Twelve (12) barangays in Maguindanao and seven (7) in North Cotabato have been affected by flooding due to continuous heavy rains which occurred from July 5- 8, 2010. Brgys affected are the following:

Current Situation

- These low-lying barangays are still flooded as run-off water from the highlands of Maguindanao and North Cotabato is still pouring in Simuay River in Sultan Kudarat; Repao River in South Upi; Buluan and Maluao in Pigcawayan; Mindanao (Rio Grande) also in Pigcawayan and adjacent areas to include Cotabato City where floodwaters are still rising but not yet alarming in some barangays
- Portion of national highway in Marbahan (Bulalo-Salimbao) area in Sultan Kudarat is still flooded but remained "one-lane" passable since 7 July 2010

Actions Taken

- ❖ Search and rescue (SAR) operations are still being conducted for the recovery of the 2 persons reported missing in South Upi.
- ❖ Local Disaster Coordinating Councils (LDCCs) concerned are still assessing the status of IDP families in Brgy Bongo; alerted those areas potentially at risk by flashfloods and landslides; and conducted rapid damage and needs assessment
- ❖ DOH and DSWD provincial field offices in Maguindanao and North Cotabato have prepositioned relief and medical items for the evacuees
