**Tropical Storm "BASYANG" continues to move away from the country.**

<b>Location of Center: (as of 10:00 P.M.)</b>	290 km West of Dagupan City
<b>Coordinates:</b>	16.2°N, 117.3°E
<b>Strength:</b>	Maximum sustained winds of 85 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 100 kph
<b>Movement:</b>	Northwest at 19 kph
<b>Forecast Positions/Outlook:</b>	Tropical Storm "BASYANG" will be at 610 km West Northwest of Laoag City tomorrow evening.

**All Public Storm Warning Signal now lowered.**

**The public and the disaster coordinating councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next bulletin to be issued at 11 AM tomorrow.**



Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
