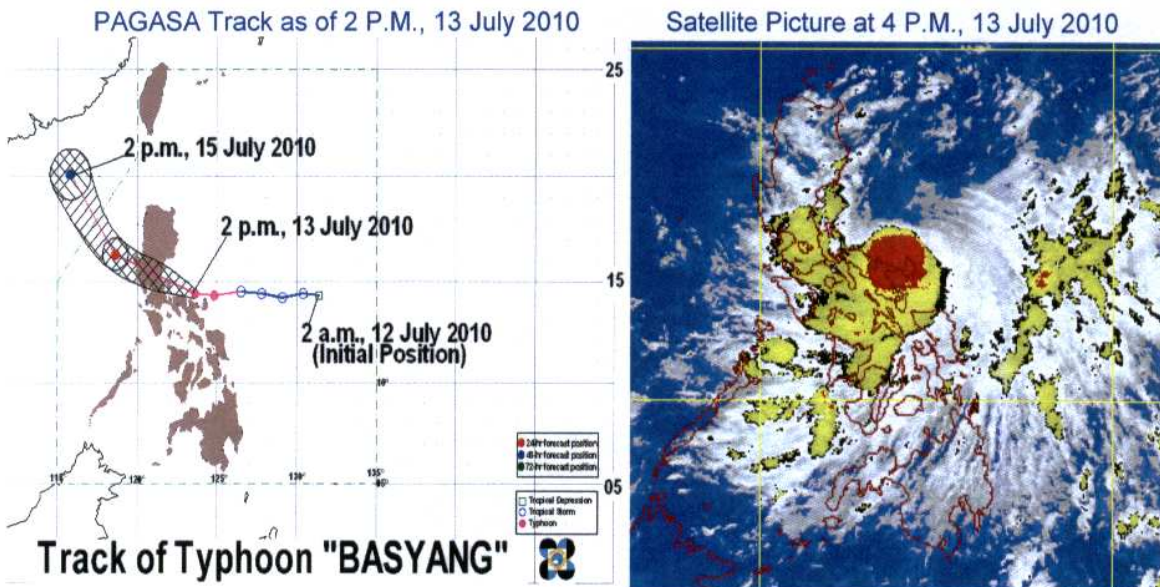

**Typhoon "BASYANG"** has maintained its strength as it moves towards Aurora and Northern Quezon Area.

<b>Location of Center: (as of 4:00 P.M.)</b>	40 km North Northeast of Daet, Camarines Norte
<b>Coordinates:</b>	14.4°N, 123.3°E
<b>Strength:</b>	Maximum sustained winds of 120 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 150 kph
<b>Movement:</b>	West at 22 kph
<b>Forecast Positions/Outlook:</b>	<i>Tonight:</i> expected to make landfall between Aurora and Northern Quezon Area

**Residents living in low lying and near mountain slopes under signals No. 3, 2 and 1 are advised to take all the necessary precautionary measures against flashfloods and landslides.**

**Those living along the coast in areas under signal No. 2 and 3 are advised to be on alert against big waves generated by the typhoon.**

**The public and the disaster coordinating councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.**

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
