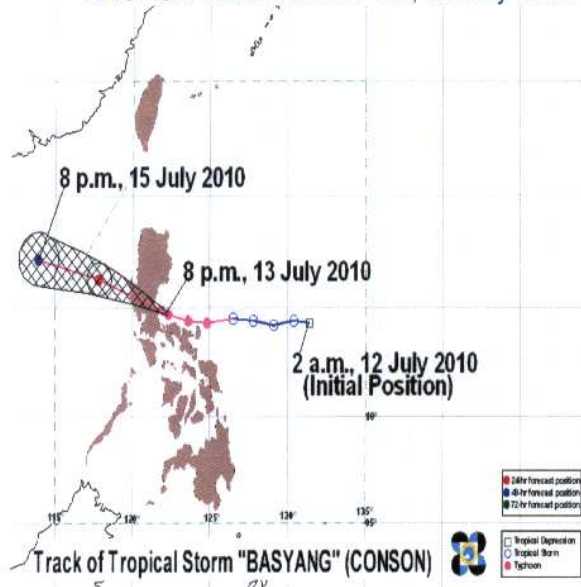

Public Storm Warning Signals elsewhere are now lowered.

Residents living in low lying and near mountain slopes under signals No. 2 and No. 1 are advised to take all the necessary precautionary measures against flashfloods and landslides.

Those living along the coast in areas under signal No. 2 are advised to be on alert against big waves generated by the storm.

The public and the disaster coordinating councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
