

### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

#### A. Chronology of Typhoon "Basyang"

##### 12 July 2010

- ❖ 4:00 AM - the low pressure area (LPA) East of Visayas had intensified into a Tropical Depression and was named "Basyang" located at 660 km East Northeast (ENE) of Virac, Catanduanes or 14.4°N, 131.0°E and with maximum center winds of 55 kph
- ❖ 10:00 AM - TD Basyang had intensified into a Tropical Storm (TS) as it moved towards Northern Luzon area located at 570 km ENE of Virac, Catanduanes or 14.4°N, 131.0°E (65 kph)
- ❖ 4:00 PM - it intensified further as it moved towards northern Luzon area located at 440 km ENE of Virac, Catanduanes or 14.3°N, 128.7°E (75 kph)
- ❖ 10:00 PM - it gained more strength as it continued to move towards Isabela Area located at 320 km East of Virac, Catanduanes or 14.5°N, 127.4°E (95 kph)

##### 13 July 2010

- ❖ 4:00 AM - further intensified as it moved towards Isabela-Aurora area located at 190 km ENE of Virac, Catanduanes or 14.6°N, 126.2°E (114 kph)
- ❖ 10:00 AM - TS Basyang intensified into a typhoon as it moved towards Aurora-Northern Quezon area located at 90 km North of Virac, Catanduanes or 14.3°N 124.4°E (120 kph)
- ❖ 4:00 PM - Typhoon Basyang maintained its strength as it moved towards Aurora and Northern Quezon area located at 40 km or 14.4°N, 123.3°E (120 kph)
- ❖ 11:00 PM - it weakened as it made landfall over Northern Quezon located in the vicinity of Infanta, Quezon or 14.8°N, 121.9°E (95 kph)

##### 14 July 2010

- ❖ 4:00 AM - TS Basyang crossed Luzon located at 90 km West of Metro Manila or 14.6°N, 120.1°E (95 kph)
- ❖ 10:00 AM - it maintained its strength as it moved away from the country

- ❖ 4:00 PM - Tropical Storm Basyang moved farther away from the country
- ❖ 10:00 PM - it continued to move away from the country located at 290 km West of Dagupan City or 16.2°N, 117.3°E (85 kph)

### **15 July 2010 (Final)**

- ❖ 4:00 AM - TS Basyang moved farther away from the country (85 kph)

## **B. Over-all Assessment**

Typhoon Basyang is the first typhoon in 2010 that crossed the mainland. However, its effects in terms of population affected, casualties and damages are very minimal compared to the effects of Tropical Storm “Ondoy” in 2009.

The strength of TS Ondoy was only 105 kph, however, prior to its landfall near the boundary of Aurora and Quezon, it brought more rainfall enhanced by southwest monsoon which caused widespread flooding in most parts of Metro Manila, Southern and Central Luzon as well as other parts of the Visayas and Mindanao. TY Basyang, while stronger at 120 kph, brought less rainfall – resulting in minimal destruction except in five (5) provinces of Region IV-A which suffered the brunt of the effects in terms of population, affecting **48,640 families** or **241,651 persons** in **709 barangays** of **88 municipalities** with minimal number of population displacement **1,132 families** or **6,267 persons** who evacuated to **46** evacuation centers. As of reporting time, there are **465 families** or **2,365 persons** inside **16 evacuation centers**.

Region IV-A has the highest number of casualties (41 dead, 30 missing and 24 injured) while Region V is highest in terms of missing 47 aggravated by maritime incidents.

In terms of damaged houses and cost of damages to agriculture and infrastructure, Region IV-A was worst-hit (**3,498** totally and **25,422** partially and PhP94.75 Million).

Only four (4) regions were affected by TY Basyang: Regions III (Aurora, Bataan, Bulacan and Pampanga); IV-A (Rizal, Cavite, Laguna, Quezon and Batangas); V (Camarines Sur, Camarines Norte and Catanduanes); and NCR (cities of Muntinlupa, Pateros and Manila). Affected municipalities in Region IV-A were the same municipalities affected by TS Ondoy in 2009.

The Rapid Damage and Needs Assessment (RDANA) teams of RDCCs III, IV-A, V and MMDA are still conducting DANA in their respective areas of responsibility to determine the actual effects of said weather disturbance. It is therefore expected that figures on Typhoon Basyang will still increase.

## **C. SUMMARY OF THE EFFECTS**

### **1. Affected Population (Tab A)**

- ❖ A total of **48,640 families/241,651 persons** were affected in **709 barangays** of **13 cities and 88 municipalities** in 12 provinces of Regions III, IV-A, V and NCR
- ❖ Sixty six (66) evacuation centers were utilized as temporary shelter to 2,478 families or 11,793 persons. As of reporting time, there are **522 families** or **2,671 persons** housed inside remaining **17 evacuation centers**.

### **2. Casualties (Tab B)**

- ❖ **Dead** – **68** (**16** in Region III; **41** in Region IV-A; **11** in Region V)

- ❖ **Missing** – **84** (6 in Region III; 30 in Region IV-A; 47 in Region V; 1 in Region VI)
- ❖ **Injured** – **30** (2 in Region III; 24 in Region IV-A; 4 in Region V)

### 3. Damages

#### a. Houses (Tab C)

- ❖ The total number of damaged houses in Regions III, IV-A and V is **31,513** (3,691 totally and 27,822 partially)

#### b. Damages (Tab D)

- ❖ The estimated cost of damage to infrastructure, agriculture, fisheries and schools in Regions III, IV-A, IV-B, V and NCR amounts to **PhP188,072,600** (Infrastructure - PhP114,655,000; Agriculture - PhP73,417,600)

#### c. Cost of Assistance (Tab E)

- ❖ The estimated cost of assistance provided is **PhP1,660,249.01** broken down as follows:

### 4. Maritime Incidents Monitored at the Height of TY Basyang

- ❖ As a result of strong winds and huge waves of 15 ft. in height triggered by Typhoon Basyang, around 62 vessels sank, capsized, totally wrecked, half submerged and ran aground in Mariveles and Limay, Bataan; Bagamanoc and Pandan, Catanduanes; Polillo, Quezon; and Sangley Point, Cavite City involving the following vessels, fishing boats, tankers and LPG carrier:
  - 40 FBs (FB Alicia A/C, FB Princess Jewel, FB Alicia Rowen, FB Mother Theresa, FB Carl Andrew, FB Rosmer, FB Faithful & True. FB Almighty, FB Jehova Rafa, FB Umico, FB Jayson, FB Aira, FB Rickmill Roy, FB Angelika Berna, and 23 other fishing boats, FB Neri, FB Joan, FB Godswill 1 and 2)
  - 4 MTs (MT Angat, MT Palo Alto, MT Maria Veronica, MT Tanker JORS of Ocean)
  - 5 MVs (MV Humero; MV Be Tres EMPC, MV Jupiter, MV BMS Saver, MV B&3)
  - 7 MBs (MB Isloff 404, MB Highland 28, MB 2 Brothers, MB Princesslyn, MB Sorlim, MB Gabriel James, MB Princess Airene)
  - 1 LCT Nicia, 2 Barges, 1 (Bismark -floating crane), 1 (LPG Carrier “Deborah Uno”), 1 (Tugboat Side Winder)

## 5. Status of Lifelines

### a. Power Restoration

- ❖ The National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP) restored transmission power load in the following sub-grids: Batangas-Ibaan-Rosario (46.67 %); Batangas-Lima Land (63%); Calaca (37.50%); Damariñas-Abubot-Rosario (9.30%); Dasmariñas 34.5 KV F1 (100%); Gumaca-Tagkawayan-Quezon (28%); Gumaca 69KV L (48.57%); Los Baños (50%); Makdan-Los Baños (57.14%); and Makban-Calamba (23.33%)
- ❖ During the NDCC Emergency Meeting held on 14 July 2010, DOE reported that strong winds caused the tripping of the north-to-south transmission backbone of the NGCP

### b. Roads and Bridges

Major roads and bridges in Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V and NCR are passable to all types of vehicles except the following:

#### Region IV-A

- ❖ Sinisian Bridge along Palico-Balayan-Batangas Road not passable to heavy vehicles due to scoured slope protection; Diokno Highway – passable to light vehicles; Tayabas-Mainit-Mauban Road – one lane passable due to road slip; Spanish Arc Bridge in Brgy Palayan, Liliw, Laguna- washed-out; Slope protection and road shoulder of Majayjay Provincial Road in Brgy San Miguel, Majayjay – washed-out

#### Region IV-B

- ❖ Manus Bailey Bridge I along Junction Labangan-Murtha-Iriron Road Brgy Batasan, San Jose in Occidental Mindoro - passable only to motor cycles and tricycles (Approach B damaged)

#### Region V

- ❖ Inalmasinan Spillway Km 148+650 along Caramoan, Catanduanes Road washed-out section were damaged

## II. HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE (per Cluster)

### Coordination Meetings Conducted

- ❖ NDCC Emergency Meeting with President Benigno Simeon Aquino III was held at the National Disaster Management Center, Camp Aguinaldo at 8:30 AM on 14 July 2010. Member agencies apprised the President on the situation and actions taken in response to the effects of TY “Basyang”. Among his directives were the following:
  - PAGASA-DOST to review what happened in the trajectory of TY Basyang and come up with lesser deviation on future weather forecasts
  - DILG to conduct inventory of areas affected by the typhoon, account for vulnerable people, and ensure that needs of affected population are attended/provided for
  - PCG to come up with a “recall system” for fishermen at sea during weather disturbance

- Concerned agencies to ensure the safe return of evacuees especially to potentially hazard areas
- ❖ RDCC V conducted an emergency assessment meetings on SAR efforts with the following directives: AFP/PNP/PCG Bicol to continue and intensify SAR efforts; PNP PRO 5 to direct local PNP stations in coastal towns to conduct SAR in respective coastlines and enlist local community; PAF-TOG5 to request immediate replacement of aircraft; and PN Islander to conduct SAR in Camarines Sur/Norte Coastline before returning to station in Cavite
- ❖ Conducted follow up SAR assessment meeting with RDCC 5 response agencies and local media with the following results: DSWD 5 to assess the needs of the affected communities specially in Camarines Norte; DOH to provide body bags to be pre-positioned at the TOG 5 for easy access; RD PRO5 to instruct maritime Police 5 to conduct SAR efforts and submit results to RDCC 5/PRO 5; identify overall liaison personnel for the uniformed men
- ❖ RDCC-OCDRC 5 conducted assessment meeting regarding SAR operations on 17 July

#### **A. Food and Non Food Items Cluster**

- ❖ President Aquino and DSWD-NCR staff visited the evacuees at the Baseco and Delpan Sports Complex in Manila on July 14, 2010 and distributed **174** family packs and **174** Saudi mats
- ❖ DSWD pre-positioned PhP106.14M standby funds and PhP135.78M worth of relief supplies (PhP 241.92 M total) in all DSWD Field Offices in Regions III, IV-A, V, NCR and DSWD National Resource Operation Center (NROC)
- ❖ DSWD Field Office (FO)-V extended 1,000 family packs worth PhP150,000 to the affected families of Siruma, Camarines Sur OCDRD IV coordinated with DOH-IV-A for the availability of cadaver bag for SAR operation in Quezon
- ❖ DSWD 5 provided relief goods in Camarines Norte with 2 PN M35 trucks to transport 475 pcs plastic mats and 650 pcs blankets
- ❖ Provided augmentation support to the LGUs in Manila, Laguna, Cavite, Camarines Sur and Camarines Norte in the form of family packs (627), blankets (165 pieces), mats (184), water (575 bottles) and assorted relief goods worth PhP920,571
- ❖ PDCC Chairman Catanduanes delivered relief goods to the families of the missing persons from the northern towns and affected households

#### **B. Health/WASH Cluster**

- ❖ DOH-HEMS - Coordinated with local CHDs in the affected Regions for the confirmation of casualties and evacuation centers and released assorted drugs and medicines and cadaver bags to CHD II and V on July 15, 2010
- ❖ CHD III released assorted drugs and medicines to PHTO Bataan on July 15, 2010
- ❖ BFP initiated water rationing at the evacuation centers as well as assisting in bringing affected families to the evacuation areas
- ❖ DOH IV-A distributed medicines and cadaver bags to the affected cities/municipalities in the region
- ❖ Director Taleon of CHD IV-A proceeded to Laguna to assess the area and provided medicines thereat

### **C. Education Cluster**

- ❖ DepEd conducted rapid damage assessment and reported that 68 schools were damaged to wit: Region III (72 classrooms in 22 ES and 4 HS); Region IV-A (23 classrooms in 20 ES and 3 HS); Region IV-B (2 classrooms in 2 ES); Region V (88 classrooms in 15 ES and 9 HS); and NCR (12 classrooms in 9 ES and 3 HS) with an estimated cost of damage amounting to PhP43.695M
- ❖ Parang Elementary School in Camarines Norte is being utilized as evacuation center with three (3) families housed thereat

### **D. Agriculture**

- ❖ The Management Information Bureau of the Department of Agriculture reported that the agricultural production in seven (7) provinces of Luzon namely: Bataan in Region III, Laguna, Rizal and Quezon of Southern Luzon in Region IV-A; Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur and Catanduanes in Region V were affected. Of the affected provinces, Rizal incurred the biggest damage on HVCC
  - Affected - 1,060 hectares (493 hectares rice; 87 has corn and HVCC (480 has) 349 completely damaged with estimated lost at 74,273 metric tones (MT) of crops (38 MT palay, 17 MT corn and 74,273 MT HVCC)
  - Details of Damages:
    - Rice – the projected loss to production is 493 MT from the affected area of 493 hectares mostly in seedling and vegetative stage amounting to PhP1 Million. Forty (40) hectares were completely damaged while 453 hectares have the chance of recovery
    - Corn – production loss is 17 MT from the affected area of 87 hectares which are in the reproductive and maturity stage
    - HVCC – production loss were 74,273 MT of assorted vegetables and bananas from the affected area of 480 hectares
    - Fisheries – damaged seaweeds, tilapia and 2 units of motorized banca with fishing gear

### **E. Camp Coordination and Management**

- ❖ DILG identified the needs of the affected LGUs in Laguna (additional rescue boats) and Camarines Norte (relief and rescue operation in relation to reports about missing fishermen and also reported two (2) isolated cases of evacuation in the coastal areas in Mariveles Bataan

### **F. Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis (DANA)**

- ❖ OCD RD V with Gov. Tallado, AFP, PN and PCG conducted aerial survey in the Province of Camarines Norte on 14 July 2010
- ❖ OCD RD-V with NFSL, PCGD Bicol, TOG5 personnel and local media conducted DANA in Catanduanes, Camarines Sur and Camarines Norte
- ❖ Provincial Disaster Management Office (PDMO) Camarines Sur deployed 3 DANA teams teams for 1st District, 2nd District and Rinconada areas to assess any landslide and flooding occurrences
- ❖ OCD IV-A coordinated with the following local line agencies in the regions such as: DA, DPWH, DOH, PNP ,DSWD, AFP and local DCCs adversely affected by Typhoon Basyang to submit damage assessment report

## G. Clearing operations

- ❖ DPWH, MMDA, AFP Engineering Brigade, BFP, PNP and LGUs conducted clearing operations along the roads and highways blocked by fallen trees, falling rocks and toppled electric posts in affected areas

## H. Search and Rescue (SAR)

- ❖ Based on the report of PNP Stations in San Antonio and Subic, Zambales, the following four (4) fishermen who were all residents of Brgy Calapacuan, Subic Zambales, were recovered alive at Brgy San Miguel, San Antonio, Zambales at 6:30 pm 15 July 2010:

- i. Melchor M Valdez, 41 y/o
- ii. Alberto M. Zamora, 55 y/o
- iii. Direck N. Arsenal, 39 y/o
- iv. Aquilino Y. Abuga, 42 y/o

The following fishermen who were residents of Brgy Calapandyan, Subic, Zambales, were recovered at Sitio Agnaem, Brgy Pundakit, San Antonio, Zambales:

- v. Boy Gomes
- vi. Liclic Chavez
- vii. Rolly Ayala

- ❖ Three (3) PAF aircraft with SAR teams from the 505th, SARG, 1 PN Islander aircraft (BN311) and 1 PN vessel (PG374) with support from 9ID were deployed in the areas of Camarines Norte and Camarines Sur to augment local SAR operations
- ❖ One (1) PAF (SAR) aircraft picked-up 3 survivors in Butuanan Island, Siruma, Camarines Sur; transported the survivors to Daet, Camarines Norte and turned-over to PDCC Camarines Norte
- ❖ Coast Guard Detachment Mercedes SAR team recovered 1 dead body via motorized banca at the vicinity of Solong Bato and Calaguas Islands, Vinzons, Camarines Norte and brought said body to Mercedes seaport for proper disposition
- ❖ Continuous SAR/retrieval operation and monitoring is being conducted
- ❖ At around 8:00 AM, 17 July, Special Force PA (1SFBn) headed by Captain Basañes on board two (2) Army Assault Watercraft recovered one dead body (still unidentified) while conducting SAR Operations along the coastal areas of Balesin Island, Polilio Group of Island, Quezon. [The said dead body has been identified as Marciano Lim, 29 years old and transported through the assistance of the Philippine Coast Guard Quezon to Atimonan.](#)
- ❖ [Meanwhile, another unidentified body was found between Mauban and Atimonan shoreline and is now at Sacred heart Chapel for identification.](#)
- ❖ At 8:30 AM, 16 July, SOLCOM dispatched one (1) helicopter to assist in the SAR operation and returned to base at 10:30 AM. Eighteen (18) survivors were rescued and six (6) dead bodies were recovered (still unidentified)
- ❖ PN (NAVFORSOL), Phil Air Force (505SARG/207THS) and Phil Coast Guard-Bicol Station on board 2 PAF Aircraft (Huey) conducted SAR on 14 July to assist local SAR teams in Catanduanes. But it was called-off due to unfavourable weather condition and the PN Vessel (PG374) with personnel from NAVSOU also returned to Tabaco Port in Albay due to unfavourable sea condition

- ❖ PN Islander Aircraft (BN311) was dispatched from Sangley Point Cavite to Legazpi City on 14 July 2010 to assist in the SAR operation
- ❖ TOG 5 helicopters conducted SAR mission in the vicinity of Calagua Island, Vinzon, Camarines Norte on 14 July 2010
- ❖ PG374 conducted SAR operations at the shorelines of Siruma, Camarines Sur and mobilized naval reservist in the AOR to support the current SAR operations in Catanduanes and Camarines Sur
- ❖ PN Islander 311 conducted aerial search in Camarines Norte area but yielded negative result
- ❖ BFP rescued 7 persons trapped in the flooded area at Brgy Halang, Calamba, Laguna
- ❖ OCDRD IV-A together with PDCC Coordinator of Quezon conducted an ocular inspection in Atimonan shorelines where three (3) fishing vessels and 2 bancas capsized. Coordinated with PCG STL and SOLCOM to dispatch two (2) teams for SAR operations. ACP was set up by Gov Suarez of Quezon, OCDRD advised ACP and SAR teams to merge with PDCC Quezon with PCG to act as the Incident Commander
- ❖ BFP Region IV-A assisted in the conduct of SAR in Atimonan, Quezon
- ❖ PNP IV-A conducted SAR operations in Brgy Poblacion, Laurel, Batangas and requested the Group Commander of 740<sup>th</sup> Combat Group, PAF, AETC, FAB Lipa City for the availability of K9 teams to assist the local Police, PCG Batangas and PNP Maritime Group in the conduct of SAR and retrieval operations of the reported missing person
- ❖ TOG 5 helicopters conducted SAR mission in the vicinity of Calagua Island, Vinzon, Camarines Norte on 14 July 2010
- ❖ PG374 conducted SAR operations at Siruma
- ❖ CDCC Tagaytay City Team conducted SAR operations for the missing victim of landslide in Brgy Dapdap East Tagaytay City
- ❖ PN Detachment Infanta provided one (1) watercraft DF 321 which departed for Balesin Island Atimonan, Quezon to conduct SAR of the 23 missing fishermen
