I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. Weather Update

- ❖ Typhoon "BASYANG" has weakened into a Tropical Storm as it made landfall over Northern Quezon. At 10:00 PM today, 13 July 2010, the center of TS Basyang was estimated in the vicinity of Infanta, Quezon (14.8 N°, 121.9°E) with maximum sustained winds of 95 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 120 kph moving West at 22 kph
- ❖ It is expected to cross Central Luzon tonight and will be at 230 km Northwest of Iba, Zambales tomorrow evening and at 610 km Northwest of Iba, Zambales by Thursday evening
- ❖ Public Storm Warning Signal (PSWS) Nos. 1 and 2 are hoisted in the following areas:

PSWS No. 2	Camarines Norte, Northern Quezon, Rizal, Aurora, Nueva Ecija, Cavite, Lubang Island, Laguna, Batangas, Bataan, Pampanga, Zambales, Tarlac, Pangasinan, Bulacan, and Metro Manila
PSWS No. 1	Catanduanes, Camarines Sur, Rest of Quezon, Marinduque, Nueva Vizcaya, Isabela, Ifugao, Benguet and La Union

- ❖ Residents in low-lying areas and near mountain slopes under signal No. 2 and No. 1 are advised to take all the necessary precautionary measures against flashfloods and landslides
- ❖ Those living along the coast in areas under signal No. 2 are advised to be on alert against big waves generated by the typhoon

C. STATUS OF LIFELINES

- ❖ Major roads and bridges in Regions I, II, III, IV-A, V and NCR are passable to all types of vehicles

D. INITIAL EFFECTS

- ❖ **Flooded Areas in NCR of 6:00 PM, 13 July 2010**

Quezon City: Aurora-Abad Santos Ave. (eight (8) inches); Tandang Sora (seven (7) inches) and Sangandaan (gutter-deep) but still passable

Manila: Delpan-Recto (knee-deep); Bambang-Abad Santos Ave. (knee-deep); Quezon Blvd.-North Bound (gutter-deep); P. Guevarra (gutter-deep); Lacson Ave. (gutter-deep), Antipolo España (knee-deep); and Pureza (gutter-deep) but still passable

- ❖ Eleven (11) fishermen in Brgy Sukdan, Bagamanoc, Catanduanes went fishing on July 12, 2010 aboard three (3) motorized banca fishing off the Eastern Pacific of Bagamanoc and failed to return home due to bad weather condition and were confirmed missing. They are identified as Melchor Chavinia, Crispin Fajardo, Rodulfo Fajardo, Eddie Cordez, Ronnie Dejarlo, Jose Rojo, Jeven Evangelista, Ramon dela Cruz, Raymundo dela Cruz, Rudy Evangelista and Noel Briones

- ❖ **Another eight (8) fishermen from Pandan, Catanduanes aboard a fishing boat were also reported missing with one (1) survivor identified as Romulado Trinidad. The eight (8) missing are identified as Rolando Trinidad, Dante Bermejo, Gener Agiditan, Albert Regalado, Nestor Lopez, Arnulfo Castella, Sonny Tudis and Jojo Caballen**
- ❖ **Local search and rescue operation is not possible as of reporting time because of stormy and rough seas over the northern area of the province**

II. HUMANITARIAN COORDINATIONS

A. PREPAREDNESS MEASURES

1. National

- ❖ NDCC OpCen issued an NDCC Advisory to all Chairman, RDCCS, PDCCs, and OCDRCs through SMS and facsimile on the Severe Weather Bulletins, 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast and General Flood Advisories issued by PAGASA, for further dissemination to their respective local disaster coordinating councils from the provincial down to the municipal levels. Likewise, issued memo through text to the concerned regions for them to list down vulnerable areas likely to be affected by Typhoon “Basyang” and preparedness measures undertaken; and **facilitated the availability of PAF Aircraft as requested by OCD5 for the conduct of damage and needs assessment in the provinces of Catanduanes, Camarines Norte, and Camarines Sur. The AFP Chief of Staff directed COMSOLCOM, Attn. U3 to preposition two (2) Heli at TOG5, PAF, Legaspi City NLT 0600H on July 14, 2010**
- ❖ The Armed Forces of the Philippines Command Center (AFPCC) issued warning orders to affected Unified Commands (UCs) to prepare their OpCon units for possible SAR and pre-emptive evacuation to affected residents; NOLCOM and SOLCOM Disaster Response Units (DRUs) and mobility assets are on standby alert; and the AFP Medical Teams aboard UCs are ready to augment local government agencies, PDCCs and RDCCs
- ❖ The DPWH’s equipment and manpower are now deployed/standby for immediate response to affected areas. Local Engineering Crew are undertaking various maintenance activities in Regions I, II, III, IV-A and V. Based on its assessment, all major roads and bridges are still passable to vehicular traffic
- ❖ The Philippine Coast Guard Action Center, through its PCG Unit Commanders in the area is closely monitoring and rendering assistance in coordination with local port authorities and shipping companies to ensure the security and safety of stranded passengers and vessels. Per PCG Memo Circular Nr. 01-09 “Guidelines on Movement of Vessels During Heavy Weather”, the following provisions shall be observed:

- PSWS No. 2 - Vessels of any tonnage shall not sail, except to take shelter, when PSWS No. 2 or higher is hoisted within its point of origin or point of destination
 - PSWS No. 1 - Vessels of 1,000 gross tons or below shall not sail, except to take shelter, when PSWS no 1 is hoisted within its point of origin or route/point of destination. On the other hand, movement of vessels above 1,000 gross tons is left to the discretion and responsibility of the ship owner and master when PSWS 1 is hoisted within its point of origin or point of destination
- ❖ The DOH–HEMS maintains 24/7 Operation Center at the national down to the regional level to monitor all events with actual or potential impacts related to TY Basyang; OpCen at the Regional level are activated and medical teams are ready for deployment (CHDs and hospitals) to conduct rapid health assessment in affected areas. Stockpiling of medical supplies and medicines at the national and regional offices
 - ❖ **The Bureau of Fire Protection issued memorandum to all Regional directors of Regions 1-12 , CARAGA, CAR, ARMM and NCR directing all BFP Units and Personnel to be on standby alert to respond to any emergency and to coordinate with respective local DCCs in the area for further instruction as the need arises**
 - ❖ **The Department of Social Welfare and Development pre-positioned Php107.38 Million standby funds and Php141.45 Million worth of relief supplies in all DSWD-Field Offices along the typhoon path amounting to Php249.71 Million, the Program Management Bureau-Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (PMB-DROMIC) is closely coordinating with the DSWD-FOS concerned for significant reports re: TS Basyang; Organized/activated 14 Quick Response Teams (QRTs) at the national level and eight (8) QRTs at the regional level consisting of an average of nine (9) members; and mobilized Social Welfare and Development (SWAD) Teams at the provincial levels for emergency management**
 - ❖ **The National Power Corporation President reported through the Department of Energy that the flood control personnel assigned at Ambuklao, Angat, Binga and San Roque facilities have been put to red alert status**
 - ❖ **The Department of Education deployed DepEd Field Engineers to be on standby in all regional centers to conduct monitoring and assessment in all schools; NCR Regional Director announced the suspension of classes in all public and private pre-schools level in Metro Manila; and disseminated copies of Department Order No. 28 s 2005 “Guidelines on the Suspension of Classes when Typhoons and Other Calamities Occur” to all DepEd Regional Offices down to DepEd Division**

- ❖ **The NHQ Philippine National Police Disaster Management Committee (PNP DMC) and National Disaster Operation Center (NDOC) has been activated effective July 13, 2010 and has issued directive to its RDs, PROs I, 2, 3, 4A, 4B, 5, NCRPO and COR to activate/operationalize respective Disaster Incident Management Task Group Operations Centers; mobilize SAR resources for immediate deployment as situation requires; coordinate with local Chief Executives and local DCCs; and provide security coverage to identified evacuation centers**

2. Regional

- ❖ RDCCs I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, CAR and NCR and their respective PDCCs have activated their respective Disaster Operations Centers (DOCs) upon receipt of the 1st NDCC Advisory on the intensification of Tropical Storm “Basyang” yesterday; alerted all member-agencies concerned and local disaster responders to take necessary precautionary measures on the possible effects of Typhoon “Basyang”; and continuously disseminating weather advisories to all RDCC-Member Agencies, local media and local DCCs
- ❖ The following regions concerned have submitted listings of vulnerable areas and preparedness activities being undertaken in response to the directive of OpCen

Region I

- OCDRC I disseminated weather update and flood advisories to RDCC-Member Agencies, local DCCs and local radio stations thru fax and sms
- Alerted response units of NFNL in Bonuan, Dagupan City and Sual; 50th IB, PA based in Narvacan, Ilocos Sur; 54th EBde in Manaog and PNP Maritime Group in San Fernando City, La Union, Dagupan City and Dasol, Pangasinan, PCG Northern Luzon are placed on alert status for response operations
- DSWD Region I has ready stockpile to augment relief resources of LGUs

Region II

- There are 777 vulnerable barangays in 48 municipalities of four (4) provinces namely: Cagayan, Quirino, Nueva Vizcaya and Isabela with an estimated 79,917 families likely to be affected
- DPWH RO2 maintenance crew and equipment are on standby in the identified critical/high risk areas
- PDCC Isabela convened a meeting for preparedness measures re: TY Basyang
- PDCC Nueva Ecija Rescue/Response Teams are on standby for deployment of heavy equipment for possible rescue operations in identified critical/ high risk areas
- PDCC Quirino is continuously monitoring the critical/high risk areas in the municipalities of Saguday and Cabarroguis and alerted all local DCCs

Region III

- There are 987 vulnerable barangays in 95 municipalities of seven (7) provinces namely: Aurora, Nueva Ecija; Tarlac; Pampanga; Bulacan;

Bataan; and Zambales with 493 families or 1,679 persons likely to be affected

- PDCCs Bulacan, Zambales, Aurora and Nueva Ecija and respective CDCCs and MDCCs have activated their DOCs and Chairmen were advised to take precautionary measures such as: pre-emptive evacuation of families living in low-lying areas and near the mountain slopes
- DSWD Region III has standby relief goods (1,000 family packs) and standby funds worth Php300,000.00

Region IV-A

- Alerted RDCC and PDCCs' Members and Civil Defense Deputized Coordinators to continuously monitor status of Nautical Highway and roll-on-roll-off port operation
- There are 129 municipalities vulnerable to flood, landslide and storm surge in 5 provinces namely: Laguna (28), Cavite (17), Rizal (14), Batangas (25) and Quezon (45)

Region IV-B

- **Alerted RDCC IV-B Members, PDCCs MIMAROPA Members, Civil Defense Deputized Coordinators, PCG, SOLCOM and WESCOM; PCG-IV-B monitored roll-on-roll-off (RORO) port operation and road condition; and suspended sea port operations in Marinduque, Mindoro and Romblon**
- **Calapan City Public Safety Department alerted all coastal barangays for possible evacuation**

Region V

- There are 23 vulnerable municipalities in Catanduanes and Camarines Norte which are likely to be affected by Typhoon "Basyang"
- OCD V coordinated with different local DCCs on their preparations to ensure that all efforts are maximized to mitigate possible effects of said weather disturbances: with LGUs on the operational status of rubber boats issued to them by NDCC for emergency response; with 903rd Bde and 901st Bde, PA to be on standby status ready for deployment in case of evacuation; and with PCG District Bicol on the status of stranded passengers
- PDCC-PDMO Camarines Sur deployed three (3) teams for 1st District, 2nd District and Rinconada areas to assess possible landslide and flooding occurrences
- PDCCs Catanduanes, Camarines Sur and Camarines Norte conducted an emergency meeting and discussed preparations in terms of stockpiling of resources such as medicines, relief goods, transportations and communication facilities to be on standby 24 hrs
- PDCC Albay advised all C, MDCCs to monitor the rainfall thru rain gauges and submit report thru the Provincial Radio Communication System and for the public to monitor latest advisories thru the local radio stations
- Coordinated with DPWH 5 re: Status of Road Networks in Catanduanes
- DSWD SWAD Teams are alerted and stockpile of relief goods are ready
- DOH 5 ensures the availability of medicines ready for distribution if needed

NCR

- OCD-NCR disseminated weather advisories to C, MMDCC; LGUs; Civil Defense Deputized Coordinators, MMDCC Member Agencies and other stakeholders for information, widest dissemination and to take appropriate actions. **Continuously monitored the status of La Mesa Dam, Angat Dam and Marikina River**
- Task Force NCR has been activated to continuously monitor the situation
- Classes in pre-school and elementary levels in NCR are suspended
- Outdoor Advertisers Association of the Philippines (OAAP) issued advisory to all its members to immediately roll down their billboards in all areas that are likely to be affected by TY “Basyang” especially in the National Capital Region

CAR

- OCD CAR disseminated weather advisories and NDCC Advisory to members of CRDCC and lower DCCs through email and facsimile
 - All DCCs are activated and were advised to undertake precautionary measures and to monitor any possible effects in their area of responsibility
 - Per dam monitoring made with PAGASA, as of 4:00 PM, Ambuclao Dam opened one (1) gate @ 25 meters
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
