I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. Weather Update

- ❖ Tropical Storm "Basyang" has weakened slightly as it moves in a northwest direction. At 4:00 PM today, 14 July 2010, the center of TS Basyang was estimated at 180 km West of Iba, Zambales (15.7 N°, 118.2°E) with maximum sustained winds of 85 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 100 kph moving Northwest at 19 kph
- ❖ It will be at 480 km West of Laoag City tomorrow afternoon.
- ❖ Public Storm Warning Signal (PSWS) No. 1 is hoisted in the following areas:

- ❖ Residents in low-lying areas and near mountain slopes under signal No. 1 are advised to take all the necessary precautionary measures against flashfloods and landslides

II. EFFECTS

A. Emergency Incidents Monitored

- ❖ Tugboat Side Winder with nine (9) crew onboard encountered trouble at vicinity San Nicolas Shoal. Prior to the incident, said tugboat is towing a barge which sunk at 6 NM NNW off Sangley Pt., Cavite City. **At 10:00 AM today, 14 July, Search and Rescue Vessel (SARV) 002 arrived at vicinity tugboat "Side Winder" and picked-up the 2 injured and 1 fisherman (Ninio Ambrosio).**
- ❖ Between 140400H-0500H July 2010, LPG Carrier "Deborah Uno" sunk while in the vicinity of Mariveles, Bataan due to strong current and big waves. CGS Bataan reported that there were eight survivors and one (1) casualty.

B. Affected Population (Tab A)

- ❖ A total of 4,935 families composed of 25,949 families were affected by TS Basyang in 74 barangays of 2 cities and 19 municipalities in Regions III, IV-A, V and NCR
- ❖ Twenty (20) evacuation centers were utilized and provided temporary shelter to 433 families or 1,911 persons

C. Status of Strandedes as of 12:00 NN, 14 July 2010

- ❖ Four thousand one hundred sixty four (4,164) persons, 134 rolling cargos, 26 vessels and 13 motor bancas were stranded in the following ports:

- ❖ Sea port operations/all trips to Marinduque, Mindoro and Romblon resumed at 9:30 AM this morning, 14 July.

D. Casualties (Details in Tab B)

Dead - 18 (1 Bataan-Region III, 15 in Region IV-A and 2 in Region V)

Missing - 57 (6 in Mariveles, Bataan-Region III; 11 in Brgy Sukdan, Bagamanoc, Catanduanes; 40 unidentified in Calaguan Island, Camarines Norte)

- ❖ Six (6) crew of the fishing vessel Alicia A/C that sunk in the vicinity of Mariveles, Bataan
- ❖ Eleven (11) fishermen in Brgy Sukdan, Bagamanoc, Catanduanes went fishing on July 12, 2010 aboard three (3) motorized banca fishing off the Eastern Pacific of Bagamanoc and failed to return home due to bad weather condition and were confirmed missing. They are identified as Melchor Chavenia, Crispin Fajardo, Rodulfo Fajardo, Eddie Cordez, Ronnie

Dajardo, Jose Rojo, Jeven Evangelista, Ramon dela Cruz, Raymundo dela Cruz, Rudy Evangelista and Noel Briones

- ❖ Eight (8) fishermen in Pandan, Catanduanes who were earlier reported missing have been recovered and admitted at Pandan District Hospital

Injured – **12** (Laguna and Rizal-Region IV-A)

E. Damages

Damaged Houses (Tab C)

- ❖ **The total number of damaged houses in Regions IV-A and V were 495 (50 totally and 445 partially).**

Damaged Infrastructure

Region III

- ❖ Breakwater structure at Brgy Poblacion, Mariveles, Bataan was damaged

Region IV-A

- ❖ Sinisian Bridge along Palico-Balayan-Batangas Road due to scoured slope protection (PhP 10M) and two (2) road slips near Diokno Highway (PhP 5M)

Region IV-B

- ❖ **Manus Bailey Bridge I along Labangan Murtha Junction Iriron Road Brgy Batasan, San Jose in Occidental Mindoro - damaged in Approach B (PhP 585,000)**

F. Status of Lifelines

Road and Bridges

- ❖ Major roads and bridges in Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V and NCR are passable to all types of vehicles **except the following:**

Region III

- Nueva Ecija-Aurora Road km 180+000 Brgy Villa Aurora, Maria Aurora, Aurora Province – not passable to all type of vehicles due to 2-meter floodwater (Detour route: San Luis-Maria Aurora-Castañeda Road)

Region IV-A

- Sinisian Bridge along Palico-Balayan-Batangas Road due to scoured slope protection (Detour Road: Diokno Highway for light vehicles only and Manila-Batangas Road for heavy vehicles)
- **Minor landslides occurred in Brgys Bakia, and Dalawitan both of Majayjay, Laguna and Brgy Turbina, Calamba City**

Region IV-B

- ❖ **Manus Bailey Bridge I along Labangan Murtha Junction Iriron Road Brgy Batasan, San Jose in Occidental Mindoro - passable only to motor cycles and tricycles**

Power Restoration/Interruptions

Power restored in the following areas:

- ❖ **NCR** - some portions of Quezon City, Balintawak, Diliman, Kamuning
- Duhat, Balintawak, Sucat substations have been energized.

- ❖ **Region I** - fully restored
- ❖ **Region III** – Sta Maria, Bulacan
- ❖ **As of 12:00 NN 14 July, National Grid Corporation of the Philippines has restored transmission power load in the following sub-grids: Bataan (1.7%); Nueva Ecija (63.59 %); Pampanga (86.4%); Tarlac (93.67%); and Zambales (31.32%)**
- ❖ **Power outage in the whole Province of Camarines Norte**

III. HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE

- ❖ **NDCC Emergency Meeting with President Benigno Simeon Aquino III was held at the National Disaster Management Center, Camp Aguinaldo at 8:30 AM today, 14 July 2010. Member agencies apprised the President on the situation and actions taken in response to the effects of TS “Basyang”.**
 - ❖ **Among his directives are the following:**
 - **PAGASA-DOST to review what happened in the trajectory of TS Basyang and future weather forecast**
 - **DILG to conduct inventory of areas affected by the typhoon, account for vulnerable people, and ensure that needs of affected population are attended/provided**
 - **PCG to come up with a “recall system” for fishermen at sea during weather disturbance**
 - **Concerned agencies to ensure the safe return of evacuees especially to potentially hazard areas**
 - ❖ **OCD Regional Director with Gov. Tallado, AFP, PN and PCG conducted aerial survey in the Province of Camarines Norte this morning, 14 July 2010**
 - ❖ **DSWD Field Office (FO)-V extended 1,000 family packs worth PhP150,000 to the affected families of Siruma, Camarines Sur**
 - ❖ **DSWD prepositioned PhP107.38 M standby funds and PhP141.45 M worth of relief supplies in all DSWD Field Offices in Regions III, IV-A, V, NCR and DSWD National Resource Operation Center (NROC)**
 - ❖ **DPWH, MMDA and LGUs have been conducting clearing operations along the roads and highways reported blocked by fallen trees, falling rocks and toppled electric posts in affected areas**
