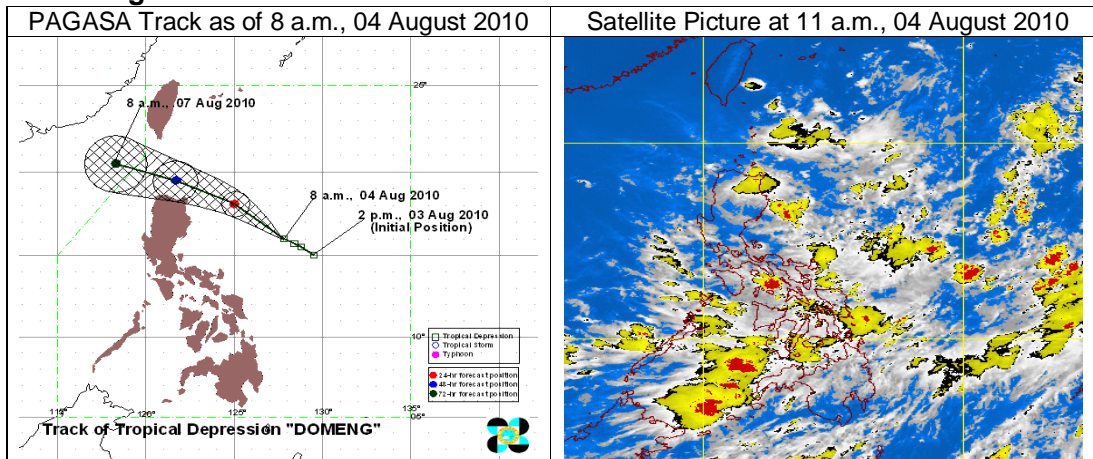
SUBJECT : Severe Weather Bulletin No. 3 re: Tropical Depression "DOMENG"

DATE : 04 August 2010, 11:00 AM

Reference: DOST-PAGASA

1. OVERVIEW:

Tropical Depression "Domeng" has maintained its strength as it continues to move in the general direction of Northern Luzon.



Location of Center: (as of 10:00 a.m.)	430 kms Northeast of Virac, Catanduanes
Coordinates:	16.2°N, 127.5°E
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 45 kph near the center
Movement:	West Northwest at 15 kph
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	<i>Thursday morning</i> 330 km East of Aparri, Cagayan <i>Friday morning</i> 120 km North of Aparri, Cagayan or 30 km North Northeast of Calayan <i>Saturday morning</i> 360 km West of Basco, Batanes
AREAS HAVING PUBLIC STORM WARNING SIGNAL	
Signal No. 1 (30-60 kph winds)	<i>Cagayan</i> <i>Isabela</i> <i>Aurora</i>

A Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on satellite and surface data at 700 kms East Northeast of Basco, Batanes(22.0°N, 129.0°E).

Residents living in low lying and mountainous areas under signal # 1 including Southern Luzon, Visayas and Northern Mindanao are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides. Fisherfolks in coastal areas are also advised against venturing into municipal waters to avoid being drifted in the open seas where unexpected changes in climatic conditions may compromise their safety.

The public and the disaster coordinating councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

2. ACTIONS TAKEN:

- NDCC Advisory was disseminated to regions concerned through SMS and facsimile for further dissemination to their respective local disaster coordinating councils from the provincial down to the municipal levels

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
