### **1. OVERVIEW:**

"Domeng" has merged with the Low Pressure Area East of Batanes and intensified into a Tropical Storm.

<b>Location of Center: (as of 4:00 p.m.)</b>	430 kms East of Basco, Batanes
<b>Coordinates:</b>	20.0°N, 126.6°E
<b>Strength:</b>	Maximum sustained winds of 65 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 80 kph.
<b>Movement:</b>	West at 19 kph
<b>Forecast Positions/Outlook:</b>	<i>Thursday afternoon</i> 40 km East of Basco, Batanes <i>Friday afternoon</i> 400 km West of Basco, Batanes
<b>AREAS HAVING PUBLIC STORM WARNING SIGNAL</b>	
<b>Signal No. 2 (61-100 kph winds)</b>	<i>Cagayan, including Babuyan and Calayan Islands</i> <i>Isabela</i> <i>Batanes Group of Islands</i>
<b>Signal No. 1 (30-60 kph winds)</b>	<i>Nueva Ecija</i> <i>Qurino</i> <i>Ifugao</i> <i>Mt. Province</i> <i>Kalinga</i> <i>Apayao</i> <i>Ilocos Provinces</i> <i>Aurora</i> <i>Nueva Vizcaya</i> <i>Benguet</i> <i>Pangasinan</i> <i>Abra</i> <i>La Union</i>

Residents living in low lying and mountainous areas under signal # 1 & 2 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides. Fisherfolks are also advised against venturing into municipal waters.

Tropical Storm "Domeng" has enhanced the Southwest Monsoon that will generate moderate to rough seas as well as bring rains which may trigger flashfloods and landslides in other areas of the country.

The public and the disaster coordinating councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

## 2. ACTIONS TAKEN:

- NDCC Advisory was disseminated to regions concerned through SMS and facsimile for further dissemination to their respective local disaster coordinating councils from the provincial down to the municipal levels

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
