SUBJECT : Severe Weather Bulletin No. 5 re: Tropical Storm “DOMENG”

1. OVERVIEW:

Tropical Storm “Domeng” has maintained its strength as it continues to move towards the Cagayan and Batanes area.

Location of Center: (as of 10:00 p.m.)	350 km East of Basco, Batanes
Coordinates:	20.0°N, 125.6°E
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 65 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 80 kph.
Movement:	West at 19 kph
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	<i>Thursday evening</i> 80 km Southwest of Basco, Batanes <i>Friday evening</i> 350 km West of Basco, Batanes
AREAS HAVING PUBLIC STORM WARNING SIGNAL	
Signal No. 2 (61-100 kph winds)	<i>Isabela</i> <i>Mt. Province</i> <i>Kalinga</i> <i>Abra</i> <i>Apayao</i> <i>Ilocos Norte</i> <i>Cagayan, including Babuyan and Calayan Islands</i> <i>Batanes Group of Islands</i>
Signal No. 1 (30-60 kph winds)	<i>Ilocos Sur</i> <i>La Union</i> <i>Pangasinan</i> <i>Benguet</i> <i>Nueva Vizcaya</i> <i>Nueva Ecija</i> <i>Qurino</i> <i>Ifugao</i> <i>Aurora</i>

Residents living in low lying and mountainous areas under signal # 1 & 2 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides. Fisherfolks are also advised against venturing into municipal waters.

Tropical Storm "Domeng" has enhanced the Southwest Monsoon that will generate moderate to rough seas as well as bring rains which may trigger flashfloods and landslides in other areas of the country.

The public and the disaster coordinating councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

2. ACTIONS TAKEN:

- NDCC Advisory was disseminated to regions concerned through SMS and facsimile for further dissemination to their respective local disaster coordinating councils from the provincial down to the municipal levels

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
