### 1. OVERVIEW:

"Domeng" has weakened into a Tropical Depression as it continues to move towards Cagayan.

<b>Location of Center: (as of 4:00 a.m.)</b>	240 km Southeast of Basco, Batanes
<b>Coordinates:</b>	19.3°N, 124.2°E
<b>Strength:</b>	Maximum sustained winds of 55 kph near the center
<b>Movement:</b>	West Southwest at 15 kph
<b>Forecast Positions/Outlook:</b>	<i>Friday morning</i> 90 km North of Laoag City <i>Saturday Morning</i> 340 km West Northwest of Laoag City
<b>AREAS HAVING PUBLIC STORM WARNING SIGNAL</b>	
<b>Signal No. 1 (30-60 kph winds)</b>	<i>Aurora</i> <i>Nueva Vizcaya</i> <i>La Union</i> <i>Isabela</i> <i>Kalinga</i> <i>Abra</i> <i>Ilocos Norte</i> <i>Cagayan, including Babuyan and Calayan Islands</i> <i>Batanes Group of Islands</i> <i>Qurino</i> <i>Benguet</i> <i>Mt. Province</i> <i>Ifugao</i> <i>Apayao</i> <i>Ilocos Sur</i>

### Public Storm Warning signals elsewhere now lowered

Residents living in low lying and mountainous areas under signal # 1 & 2 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides. Fisherfolks are also advised against venturing into municipal waters.

Meanwhile, a Low Pressure Area was estimated at 940 km East of Luzon (16.5°N 132.5°E).

The public and the disaster coordinating councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

**2. ACTIONS TAKEN:**

- NDCC Advisory was disseminated to regions concerned through SMS and facsimile for further dissemination to their respective local disaster coordinating councils from the provincial down to the municipal levels

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
