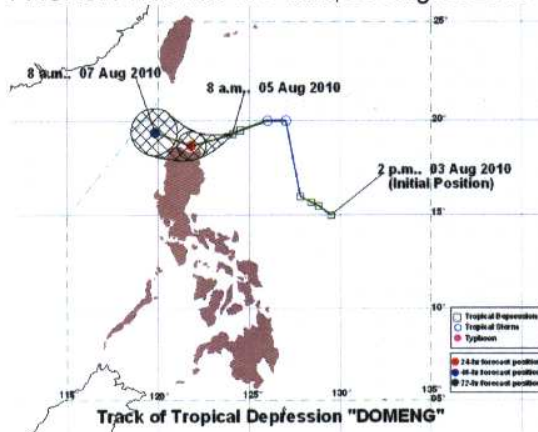

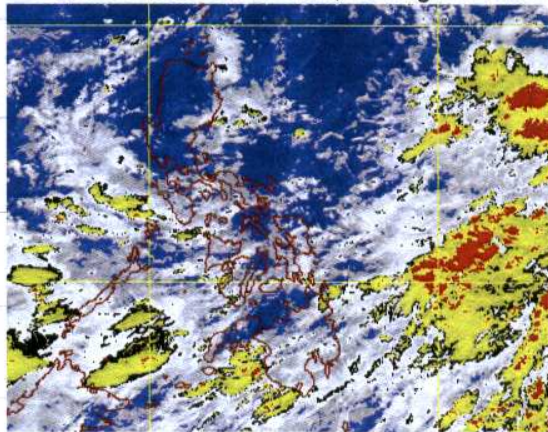
1. OVERVIEW:

"Domeng" has weakened slightly as it moves in a West Southwest direction.

Tropical Depression “Domeng” and the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated at 850 kms East of Luzon (16.5°N, 131.5°E) would still enhance the Southwest Monsoon and bring rains over the country.

Residents living in low lying and mountainous areas are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides. Fisherfolks are also advised against venturing into municipal waters.

The public and the disaster coordinating councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
